Rules to be adhered to by a promoter or sponsor of a Amateur Boxing or Wrestling exhibition:

1. The promoter or sponsor of a boxing or wrestling exhibition must produce to a certified Commissioner evidence of insurance coverage for any and all personal injury to the participants.
2. There must be proper police protection to maintain law and order in and on the premises of said exhibition. Two officers of the City Police Department must be inside with two additional officers outside to handle parking. the officers outside may be members of the auxiliary or emergency police.
3. There must be a qualified Physician, EMT or Registered Nurse in attendance during the entire exhibition.
4. A list of contestants for the exhibition must be presented to the Commission three (3) days prior to the date of the exhibition.
5. The boxing wrestling exhibition must start promptly at the time scheduled. A fifteen minute delay will be allowed in the event of cancellation of a bout with just cause.
6. Before a wrestling exhibition may begin, the names of the participants the amount each is to be paid, and the money itself must be given to a certified Commissioner. In turn, this Commissioner will pay the contestants after they have fulfilled their obligations insofar as a wrestling exhibition or boxing bout.
7. The only members of the Boxing and Wrestling Commission to receive payment for their services are:

Timekeeper	\$10.00
Doorman	\$10.00
8. In the event a legitimate complaint of unpaid expenses or bills incurred in the promotion of the exhibition is filed with the Commission, a hearing will be scheduled. If the promoter or sponsor is found guilty at such hearing, the Commission will invoke a suspension of the promoter's or sponsor's license.

ORDINANCE NO. 34-80

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 721.02 AND 721.05 BOXING & WRESTLING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF LORAIN CODIFIED ORDINANCES.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LORAIN, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 721.02 of the Lorain Codified Ordinance Boxing & Wrestling which reads as follows:

721.02. BOXING & WRESTLING COMMISSION

There is established a Boxing and Wrestling Commission to consist of seven members to be appointed by the Mayor to serve at his pleasure. The Mayor shall also appoint a secretary to the Boxing and Wrestling Commission who shall keep the minutes and make an annual report of the activities of the Commission.

be amended to read as follows:

721.02. BOXING AND WRESTLING COMMISSION

There is established a Boxing and Wrestling Commission to consist of nine members including a secretary to be appointed by the Mayor and to serve at his pleasure. The secretary shall keep the minutes and make an annual report of the activities of the Commission to the Mayor.

SECTION 2. That Chapter 721.05 of the Lorain Codified Ordinances Boxing & Wrestling which reads as follows:

721.05. LICENSES FOR EXHIBITION

The Office of the Mayor shall issue specific licenses and charge the following fees therefor:

Professional Promotor (per exhibit)-----	\$25.00
Professional Exhibit Permit (each)-----	\$ 5.00
Amateur Promotor-----	\$ 5.00
Amateur Matchmaker-----	\$ 5.00
Amateur Exhibit permit-----	\$ 1.00

Licenses shall be obtained annually commencing on or after January 1 of any year and shall expire on December 31 of the year of issuance.

be amended to read as follows:

721.05. LICENSES FOR EXHIBITION

The Office of the Mayor shall issue specific licenses and charge the following fees for Boxing and Wrestling Exhibitions:

Professional Promoters License -Annual-----	\$50.00
Professional Exhibit Permit (each exhibit)---	\$25.00
Amateur Promotor License - Annual-----	\$10.00
Amateur Exhibit Permit (each exhibit)-----	\$ 5.00

Annual licenses shall be valid for one year from date of issue by the Mayor.

SECTION 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22, Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

721.01 COMMISSION TO CONTROL.

The conduct and exhibition of boxing and wrestling contests shall be permitted in the City under the control and supervision of the Boxing and Wrestling Commission, as hereinafter provided. (Ord. 8487. Passed 5-6-63.)

721.02 BOXING AND WRESTLING COMMISSION; SECRETARY.

There is established a Boxing and Wrestling Commission to consist of nine members including a Secretary to be appointed by the Mayor and to serve at his pleasure. The Secretary shall keep the minutes and make an annual report of the activities of the Commission to the Mayor. (Ord. 34-80. Passed 4-7-80.)

721.03 APPLICATION FOR PERMITS; EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS AND PARTICIPANTS.

Applications for boxing and wrestling exhibitions shall be made to the Boxing and Wrestling Commission. It shall be the duty of the Commission to make or cause to be made thorough investigations of all such applications to determine the financial responsibility and the general character of all the applicants, the fitness of the prospective participants in the boxing or wrestling exhibitions proposed, and such other matters as may be pertinent to the granting of the permit.

The Commission shall report the results of its examinations to the Mayor with a recommendation whether each such permit should be granted or not.

The Mayor may grant such permits in accordance with State law. No boxing or wrestling exhibition shall be held within the City unless authorized by such a permit. (Ord. 8487. Passed 5-6-63.)

721.04 RULES OF COMMISSION; ENFORCEMENT.

The Boxing and Wrestling Commission shall make and may amend, alter or repeal such rules as it may deem necessary in the public interest to regulate and control the conditions and conduct of boxing and wrestling exhibitions. The Commission may suspend and/or fine any promoter, manager, boxer or wrestler pursuant to its rules. It shall be the duty of the Commission to enforce and see to the enforcement of its rules. (Ord. 8487. Passed 5-6-63.)

721.05 LICENSES FOR EXHIBITION; FEES.

(a) The Office of the Mayor shall issue specific licenses and charge the following fees for boxing and wrestling exhibitions:

(1) Professional Promoters License –Annual	\$50.00
(2) Professional Exhibit Permit (each exhibit)	\$25.00
(3) Amateur Promoter License – Annual	\$10.00
(4) Amateur Exhibit Permit (each exhibit)	\$ 5.00

(b) Annual licenses shall be valid for one year from date of issue by the Mayor. (Ord. 34-80. Passed 4-7-80.)

721.06 FEES FOR EXHIBITIONS.

Grantees of permits for professional boxing or wrestling exhibitions shall pay to the City Treasurer a fee equal to three percent of the gross receipts of the boxing and wrestling exhibition held under such permits, excluding any taxes which may be imposed under Federal or State law, provided, however, that no fee greater than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) shall be required.

The secretary of the Boxing and Wrestling Commission shall be the representative of the City Treasurer, who shall be authorized and empowered to receive payment of the aforesaid three percent of the gross receipts for and on behalf of the City Treasurer. (Ord. 8487. Passed 5-6-63.)

721.07 DEPOSITS.

All money received by the Boxing and Wrestling Commission pursuant to its rules, regulations, requirements and standards shall be deposited immediately in the Special Recreation Fund of the Recreation Board. (Ord. 8487. Passed 5-6-63.)
